

How much solar power does Albania have?

The International Renewable Energy Agency calculated that solar power capacity in Albania rose by 5 MW last year, to 22 MW. State-owned power utility KESH recently completed its 5.1 MW solar power plant at a hydropower dam. A 1 MW floating photovoltaic system, which sunk last spring just days after commissioning, has just been repaired.

How much does a solar power project cost in Albania?

Still, the Ministry of Infrastructure and Energy awarded 283.9 MW. The lowest offer came in at EUR 39.7 per MWh, against a starting level of EUR 59.97 per MWh. Eight consortiums won 15-year power purchase agreements (PPAs) today in Albania for their solar power projects as the Ministry of Infrastructure and Energy opened their bids.

What is the largest solar power plant in Albania?

In late 2023 the 140MW Karavasta solar power plant was completed, having taken 15 months to build, it is the largest in Albania to date. A 100 MW solar power project called Spitalla in Durrës area is planned to be built next. Albania has enormous potential for electric energy from wind power.

How many photovoltaic plants are there in Albania?

The two remaining projects are Premium Solar Park 1 by Premium Energy, of 30 MW, and Sharp Solar Park 1 by Sharp Energy, with a planned capacity of 20 MW. The report adds there are currently 12 photovoltaic plants in operation in Albania with a combined capacity of 23 MW, which sold electricity for EUR 71.2 per MWh to the government last year.

Is Albania a good place for solar energy?

Albania gets about 2100-2700 hours of sunshine in a year so it has a great potential for solar energy. Solar energy is easily accessible since most energy comes directly or indirectly from the sun. It could be used for heating and lighting homes, commercial, and industrial buildings.

Who won a solar project in Albania?

Smart Gynesh Energy, Smart Energy Group and Erseka Solar were selected for two lots: 40.3 MW at EUR 53.53 per MWh and 20.2 MW at EUR 56.28 per MWh. JGA consulting, Swiss Approval Albania, Eterna and Gr Albania secured 15.2 MW at a price of EUR 54.7 per MWh. Solar PV, Gr Albania, Enterprise Albania and RAB won 29.13 MW at EUR 54.8 per MWh.

Albania's Primary Energy Supply Trend In 2022, renewable energy accounted for 41.3% of Albania's TPES, including hydro, solar/wind/others, and biofuels and waste. Specifically, hydro accounted for 27.1%, biofuels and waste 12.8%, and solar/wind/others 1.3%.
