Why is Burundi launching a solar PV plant?

The pioneering 7.5 MW solar PV plant has increased Burundi's generation capacity by over 10%, and is the country's first substantial energy generation project to go online in over three decades, supplying clean power to tens of thousands of homes and businesses - just before the start of COP26. What does Burundi's solar plant announcement mean for the energy sector?

What is the solar potential of Burundi?

The solar potential of Burundi is very interesting. The average annual power received is around 2000 kWh /m²; per year, equivalent to the best European regions (southern Mediterranean). One of the main challenges is to develop a sustainable fire wood supply.
