Why is Guinea-Bissau called Bissau?

Upon independence, declared in 1973 and recognised in 1974, the name of its capital, Bissau, was added to the country's name to prevent confusion with Guinea (formerly French Guinea). Guinea-Bissau has had a history of political instability since independence. The current president is Umaro Sissoco Embaló, who was elected on 29 December 2019.

Guinea-Bissau, one of the world's poorest and most fragile countries, has a population of about 1.8 million. Guinea-Bissau's Atlantic Ocean coast is composed of an archipelago, the Bijagos, of more than 100 islands.

Though a small country, Guinea-Bissau has several ethnic groups which are very distinct from each other, with their own cultures and languages. This is due to Guinea-Bissau being a refugee and migration territory within Africa. Colonisation and racial intermixing brought Portuguese and the Portuguese creole known as Kriol or crioulo. [102]
