Will Saudi Arabia handle OPEC+ cut in oil production?

Saudi Arabia, he says, may need to handle the bulk of any potential production cut. The 2 million bpd cut in oil production was backed by Saudi Arabia and could benefit Russia. The OPEC+ meeting took place as much of the world is battling soaring energy costs and rising inflation.

How much oil does Saudi Arabia produce a day?

The extension, which was first shared by the state-owned Saudi Press Agency citing a Energy Ministry source, means the kingdom's crude production will stand at about 9 million barrels a day through the end of June.

Which OPEC+ countries have cut a lot of barrels a day?

Announcements from several OPEC+ countries extend reductions of some 2.2 million barrels a day, the secretariat for the multinational organization noted Sunday. Saudi Arabia led the pack by extending its previously-implemented cut of 1 million barrels a day through the end of 2024's second quarter.

Are Saudis trying to push prices back to \$100 per barrel?

Yasser Elguindi, the head of macro research at Energy Aspects, says there's a perception that the Saudis are trying to push prices back to or above \$100 per barrel by cutting production and tightening the market. He says the magnitude of the proposed cut has caught people by surprise.

Why did Saudi Arabia take 2 million oil off the market?

The world consumes up to 100 million barrels of oil a day, so taking 2 million off the market would have a noticeable effect. The move is seen as a bid by Saudi Arabia to prop up prices, which had reached up to \$120 a barrel during the spring but began to tail off over concerns about a slowing global economy.

Are OPEC+ members deepening their voluntary crude supply cuts?
