Does Eswatini have electricity?

Despite being one of Africa's smallest countries, Eswatini has an impressive, diverse topography and climate. Unfortunately, its electricity infrastructure is not reliable.

Can solar power help Eswatini achieve its electrification goals?

Although Eswatini's electrification rates are relatively high, they are still a long way off 100% (the country's target for 2022). Solar power is the most viable solution for Eswatini to help meet its electrification goals and save costs down the line.

What is driving Eswatini's growth?

The biggest driver of growth in Eswatini's PV market is private PV projects. In 2022, Eswatini partnered with Frazium Energy to commission a new 100MW solar storage project with 75,000 PV panels, hoping to produce more than 100 million kWh of electricity a year and generate at least 200 jobs.

Frazium Energy has entered into a EUR100 million contract with the government of the Southern African kingdom of Eswatini for a solar battery project. The contract has been entered for a period of 40 years. With an initial capacity of 100 MW, the project will be located at the Edwaleni Power Station in the town of Matsapha.

Frazium Energy has signed a contract with the Eswatini government to develop a solar PV and storage project. The first phase is expected to consist of a 25-30MW solar PV component with a 100MW lithium-ion battery, supplying about 100GWh/yr at a cost of \$115m, according to chief executive Robert Frazer.

Frazer Solar is developing a large-scale solar-storage project for IPP investor, owner and operator Frazium Energy. Phase 1 of the development involves solar PV coupled with battery storage to provide 200 MWh of dispatchable baseload electricity per day.
