# What are monocrystalline solar cells?

Monocrystalline solar cells are typically cut into shapes that are octagonal, square with rounded corners, or semi-round. Monocrystalline solar cells are also made from a very pure form of silicon, making them the most efficient material for solar panels when it comes to the conversion of sunlight into energy.

# What is a mono crystalline solar panel?

The name "mono-crystalline" indicates that the wafer is made from single-crystal silicon. In mono wafers the electrons that generate a current have more room to move, making monocrystalline solar panels more efficient. From ingot to wafer to cell: Both mono and poly cells go through these general steps. The silicon ingot is sliced into thin wafers.

These wafers have a blackappearance to them, which tends to look more aesthetically pleasing than the blue hue you find in other panels. Having a single-crystal structure means the electrons that produce electricity have more room to move around, making monocrystalline solar cells highly efficient.

### How do you identify mono crystalline solar cells?

Elements allowing the silicon to exhibit n-type or p-type properties are mixed into the molten silicon before crystallization. You can identify mono-crystalline solar cells by the empty space in their corners where the edge of the crystal column was. Each cell will also have a uniform pattern as all of the crystals are facing the same way.
